

Program Offerings

This program provides a safe place for children to be between the hours of 3-6 pm while their parents are still working. We offer homework help, snacks, social development and recreation. IUPUI America Reads tutors work one-to-one with students to help improve their reading skills. Eli Lilly volunteers have a well established music program where they teach the children to play piano, violin, trombone, saxophone, and drums.

A. R. I.S. E.
Accepting Responsibility for Image and Self-Esteem. This program works with youth ages 15-25 who are not in high school to help them gain valuable job skills training. The ARISE curriculum is designed to encourage participants to use the knowledge and skills they learn in the program to help them achieve gainful employment.

Asanté Children's Theatre

ACT uses the three basic genres of performing arts (theatre, music, dance and storytelling) to develop the life skills of young people ages 12 to 21.



Christamore House Boxing
The collaboration between Indy PAL and Christamore House has really paid off. The program teaches participants to be healthy, disciplined, committed. The boxers participate in competitions locally and nationally.



This program works with children ages 3-5 years to enhance their current skills while introducing new

skills at a pace which children are comfortable learning. Through literacy, mathematics, the arts and quality care, this program provides early childhood education and prepares children for kindergarten.

"Family Unity Night"
Once each month, this family event focuses on food, fun and fellowship. Staff and volunteers prepare wholesome meals and play games where participants win prizes. This is also a time to share information with the community about upcoming events. Many times a guest speaker is featured to discuss family issues such as financial literacy, health and fitness, or neighborhood safety.



Senior Citizens

This program engages senior citizens in socialization, health and fitness, safety and senior benefits, field trips and recreation. A hot meal is provided daily through Second Helpings. Gleaners Food Bank provides a monthly care package for every senior enrolled. 2008 is the first year the Marjorie "Marge" Kroeger Active Senior Award was presented to acknowledge active seniors.

Social (Family Support) Services

Our Social Service Department plays an integral role in the support system of many Westside families. We receive both federal and local funds to help families with emergency services such as rent and utility assistance. Our Social Services Department works with many other service providers throughout the Indianapolis community.



Academic Celebration
This initiative celebrates Haughville students for earning straight A's or making the Honor Roll.

Summer Enrichment Camp

Youth ages 6-13 enjoy an adventurous 10-week program during the summer break. Highlights include math and reading classes and computer training with plenty of recreation. Each afternoon the campers take field trips to museums, parks, skating, bowling, swimming, the zoo and many other fun and educational sites in Marion County.



Teen Opportunity Program (TOP)
This program is for inschool teenagers grades 9-12. The program uses the Community Works curriculum to teach youth how to keep themselves and their communities safe. This social development program includes tutoring, mentoring, college visits, leadership training, and service learning projects, recreation,

Youth Employment Services (YES)

The YES program works with Marion County youth ages 17-25 that are not in high school to help them achieve education, employment and/or training, through the development of a goal oriented service plan and support for overcoming barriers. This program is funded by the Lilly Endowment through the Indianapolis Private Industry Council.




